There has been a great emphasis on the children in these schools drinking tap water that has fluoride instead of drinking pop or bottled water. All of the schools in these two systems have water dispensers for children to refill their bottles. The water was tested by Dr. Hopper, and it was determined that the water filling systems did not

remove the fluoride needed in tooth development.

Although we have only 20 members in our First District Dental Alliance, our group has been active in taking part in dental health projects in the community and by providing financial assistance to clinics in our three cities; Healing Hands of Bristol, Friends in Need in Kingsport, and Keystone Dental in Johnson City.
